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### Sat 18 January 2025 – Cotswolds LMC AGM and Annual Dinner – Angela Leaman

We will be returning to the Cotswolds for our AGM next January. The venue will be the Hatton



Court Hotel which is located near Painswick and 12 minutes' drive from Gloucester station. The Cotswold Way passes close by and there is good walking to explore. The AGM and private dinner will be held in the Cotswold Room.

I have a provisional booking for 14 rooms for Saturday night which will be held until the end of November. Bookings can be extended on request to Friday, for those who wish to arrive the night before. Walks will be arranged for mid-morning Saturday and on Sunday morning.

To book your place please call the hotel

directly on 01452 617412 and quote my name to link into the LMC group booking and discount rate. Guests will be required to pay in full for Saturday dinner/accommodation at the time of booking, but Friday night can be paid for on arrival. Friday dinner can be at the hotel, or there is a cheap and cheerful pub 5 minutes' drive away at the Kings Head in Upton St Leonards.

The rates are as follows:-

**Saturday DB&B:** Double £149 (total for 2 people); Single occupancy £129.

**Friday B&B:** Double £109; Single £99. Note there is no provisional booking held for Friday. The hotel is unlikely to be busy but advise booking early to ensure availability if staying two nights. All rooms will be Executive/Superior grade.

Any unallocated rooms were released at the end of November, so if you still wish to book please contact the hotel for availability.

**T&C:** Bookings can be cancelled free of charge until 7<sup>th</sup> December. After 7<sup>th</sup> December we can cancel 2 rooms free of charge up to 48 hours prior to the event. Further cancellations will be charged in full.

We have 82 walks in 9 days in and around the Bannau Brycheiniog National Park, from 2 to 17 miles and up to 3,600 ft ascent at the top end. Almost 40% sold so far and three walks booked out already but still loads of variety available.

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### **Fri 9 - Sun 11 May 2025 - Gower, Wales – David Wells**

It's a few years since the club visited the Gower (and actually not sure I've ever been!) and will be a few years before John reaches there on the coastpath, so I'm organising a weekend meet in May, avoiding the public holidays. The Gower is great for coastal walks stretching from Rhossili in the west through Oxwich to The Mumbles in the East but also has some interesting if lowish hills.

I'm proposing to base the weekend in Reynoldston, which is slightly inland and away from the tourists. You are welcome to add either Thursday or Sunday nights as well - I will organise a full day walk on Saturday, probably walking from Reynoldston, and a longish half day on Sunday depending on interest. We will arrange dinners later - the King Arthur is well rated. I've blocked 3 rooms until end December at each of Rushbrook Cottage (which takes pets) and Hills Court B&Bs (no pets), both of which offer continental breakfast in the room. For anyone wanting full English breakfast, the King Arthur hotel is also available. There are not too many other B&Bs so get in quick. If you wish to come, please contact the B&Bs directly quoting my name and/or LMC. Contact details are Claire Lloyd for Rushbrook Cottage and Jill John for Hills Court. Both are also available on Airbnb. There's also 1 room available at Luddington Grange (Carol though I haven't blocked this). Most rooms are £80 or £90 single or double.

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## Meet Reports

### Teddington to Chiswick – 17 November 2024

I was joined by Teresa and Martin for this walk along the Surrey side of the River Thames, starting from Teddington Lock. The walk was timed to coincide with low tide during the annual draw-off, when Richmond half lock is left open so the river is tidal up to Teddington, exposing the river bed and allowing for essential maintenance checks and repairs.

We were fortunate with a bright although cold day with glorious autumn colours on display.

We stopped at Richmond for coffee and a closer look at Richmond bridge – the dark marks on the piers show how much is usually underwater.



Richmond also has the issue of high tides but one enterprising pub has a solution:



We walked as far as Richmond Lock but then needed to cross to the Middlesex side as the path onwards to Kew Bridge is closed due to a breach in the river bank.

This picture of the damage was taken from the river: the railing shows where the path used to be:



We walked past former wharves and a boatyard to Old Isleworth; then through Syon Park with a short detour to see a plaque commemorating Pocahontas who briefly lived nearby:



At Brentford Lock we took a detour along by the River Brent/Grand Union Canal to see the extensive redevelopment in this area. We saw lots of evidence of former industry: a railway bridge to Brentford Dock, more old wharves and former dry docks. We passed the site of Brentford Gas Works; now covered by the (sadly derelict) Watermans Arts Centre and adjoining Watermans Park. The tide had been rising for some time so by this point, water was lapping the path. Once we reached Kew Bridge it was time to leave the river for the short distance to our house where Clare (sometime guest of LMC) provided a delicious and warming lunch.
